Dr. Maša Kovič Dine is an Assistant Professor at the Department of International Law at the Faculty of Law, University of Ljubljana. After graduating the Faculty of Law, University of Ljubljana, she continued her studies at the Faculty of Law, University of Toronto, where she also worked at the Research Group for G7/G8 countries. She defended her PhD thesis in International Environmental Law on the topic of international forest protection at the Faculty of Law, University of Ljubljana, where she has been teaching an array of courses at both undergraduate and graduate level including Law of the Sea. She is also a mentor to student teams competing at international moot court competitions, a mentor of the International Environmental Law Clinic, mentor in the national Environmental defenders program, and the conference coordinator of a series of international interdisciplinary scientific conferences entitled Contemporary Challenges of International Environmental Law and Responsibility to Protect in Theory and Practice. Among other professional affiliations, she is a Secretary of the Slovene Branch of the International Law Association (ILA) and a member of the World Commission for Environmental Law of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN).
